

Nandankanan Zoological Park is one of the finest large zoos of India established on 29th December, 1960. The State Botanical Garden with an area of 75 hectares and adjoining two important wetlands Kanjia lake (66 ha.) and Kiakani lake (25 ha) make the Nandankanan an ideal centre for Research, Education, Conservation breeding. The Zoological Park together with Kanjia lake and Botanical Garden has been declared as Nandankanan Wildlife Sanctuary over an area of 4.37 sq.km. (Notified on 3rd August, 1979). The park is under the management of the Government of Odisha, Forest Environment & Climate Change Department and followings the norms and guidelines laid by Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi, Govt of India.

GLIMPSE OF IMPORTANT HAPPENING

National Zoo Directors Conference at Bhubaneswar

A two days National Conference for Zoo Directors was organized by Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi & Nandankanan Zoological Park at Bhubaneswar. The conference was inaugurated by Shri Bhupender Yadav, Hon'ble Minister for Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India. Shri Ashwini Kumar Choubey, Hon'ble Minister of State for Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India, Shri Pradeep Kumar Amat, Hon'ble Minister Forest, Environment and Climate Change Department, Govt. of Odisha, Mrs Aparajita Sarangi, Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Bhubaneswar, Shri Satyabrata Sahu, Additional Chief Secretary, Forest, Environment and Climate Change Department, Government of Odisha, Shri Debidutta Biswal, Principal Chief Conservator of Forest & Head of Forest Force, Odisha, Shri Sushil Kumar Popli, Principal Chief Conservator of Forest & Chief Wildlife Warden, Odisha were present. During the inaugural, MEE-Zoo 2022, Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav- A compilation (Vol II), 2nd Edition of Field Guide for Rehabilitation of Indian Pangolin and a short video compilation of activities undertaken during the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav were released by Hon'ble Minister along with the dignitaries on the dais. First day overviewed on pillars of change, targets, call for action and way forward with experience sharing followed by discussion. Second day covered holistic planning of conservation breeding of priority species in zoos, evaluation criteria of MEE of Zoo to better management practices in zoos. The valedictory session was graced by Shri Pradeep Kumar Amat, Hon'ble Minister Forest, Environment and Climate Change Department, Govt. of Odisha, Shri Debidutta Biswal, Principal Chief Conservator of Forest & Head of Forest Force, Shri Sushil Kumar Popli, Principal Chief Conservator of Forest & Chief Wildlife Warden, Odisha. Short movies on visual tour of Nandankanan Zoological Park and Species recovery of Gharial were released during the valedictory session by the Chief Guest. The National Conference for zoo directors was a successful event with the attendance and active participation of more than 70 zoo directors, prominent dignitaries, media personnel and experts from various fields of wildlife conservation and wildlife health. During the conference Hon'ble Union Minister, Minister of State, MS, CZA and Zoo Directors were visited the zoo.

ZOO LABORATORY

To strengthen the diagnostic and research work on zoo animal, the Zoo Laboratory is being developed to carry out microbiological, molecular, reproductive diagnostic test needed for zoo animals' health care, physio-chemical and microbiology examination of water sources providing water to visitors and animals of Nandankanan. The zoo laboratory is being established with the above objective with an expenditure of Rs 60 lakhs.

MODULAR PM HOUSE & INCINERATOR COMPLEX



Modular PM House has been developed over an area of 1237 sq. ft with vitrified floor and will have the following facilities. Pathologist chamber $(14 \times 20 \text{ ft})$ with wardrobes containing personal protective clothing, attached toilets, wash sink, sit outs for small discussion of pathologist and his team. Necropsy Hall $(20 \times 20 \text{ ft})$ with independent wide entry and exit gates for carrying the trolley with carcass, wide dissection area for the large animals, modern stainless steel mobile hydraulic dissection table with overhead light for dissection/viscera preparation. Morgue (Carcass holding area) cum staff preparation room (20 × 20ft) with Wash (Decontamination) sink for washing of instruments after post-mortem, big size Instrument rack for keeping all post-mortem instruments, two body mortuary refrigerator, two number of wheeled trolleys for carrying carcass and weighing machine (1000kg capacity). The facility is being developed with an estimated cost of Rs. 30,43,600/-.





Two numbers of Incinerators of capacity 100 kg and 50 kg have been already installed for Management of Solid wastes like disposal of animal carcass, left over feed/bones/flesh and biodegradable materials. The incinerators 100 kg and 50 kg were installed with expenditure of Rs 26,59,552/- and Rs 15,20,000/-, respectively and Rs 17,00,000/- each for the construction of incinerator house. These incinerators are smokeless and environmental friendly.





CARNIVORE QUARANTINE WARD

The new quarantine facility is being developed to house new animal on arrival in western side of zoo (near the back gate) away from the zoo animal enclosures to prevent any cross infection. Presently the quarantine facility for carnivores is being developed over an area of 1034 sqm and having provision of 4 kraals (15mX10mX4.5m), 8 retiring cells (3.25mX3mX3m) and 4 sliding squeeze cages along with 02 keeper corridors (23mX2.5mX3m) to house the large carnivores. This facility is being developed with an amount of Rs. 1,08,69,200/-. Other sections for giving quarantine facility to herbivores, birds and reptiles will be added in future.



INDIAN FOX ENCLOSURE

New display area of Indian fox enclosure area was constructed on an area of 350 sq mt. in the year 2021-22. The total cost of construction is Rs 13.00 lakhs. The fox enclosure is now having glass fronted open top display area, three feeding cells with old display area converted as back kraal. The fox display is well planted with beautiful landscaping which will enhance animal welfare and beauty of the enclosure for successful breeding and display of the animals.

Species in focus: Indian Chevrotain (*Moschiola indica*)

"Chevrotain" comes from the French word "chevrot" (kid or fawn), derived from the Middle French chevre (goat). The Indian chevrotain is the smallest ungulate species in India and is commonly known as "Mouse deer". It is found across peninsular India except the Himalayas, Deserts and North-east India. It is extremely rare to spot this species in the wild as it is nocturnal, elusive and cryptic. They inhabit dense forested areas in moist evergreen, semi evergreen and tropical deciduous forests. They are solitary animals with small home range. They communicate through scent marks and vocalizations. Primarily herbivorous, fruits form an important part of their diet. Nandankanan Zoological Park is breeding mouse deer since 1971 and a participating zoo for conservation breeding of mouse deer since 2009. There have been 50 births of mouse deer in captivity since 1971 including 30 births under the conservation breeding programme, i.e., after 2009. Presently the zoo is having 27 mouse deer (13:10:4) and going ahead with conservation breeding



HEALTHCARE HIGHLIGHTS

Successful hand rearing of one white tiger cub and one Asiatic lion cub

One white tiger cub rejected by mother after birth due to lack of sufficient maternal instinct was rescued and raised by bottle feeding at 'Hand rearing Centre' of the zoo. One 19-day old Asiatic



lion cub became sick and has to be separated from the mother for treatment and ultimately hand raised by bottle feeding. Both were reared together with utmost care and precautions, presently both of them are doing well with normal growth rate.

Successful management of traumatic myiasis in upper eyelid of an ostrich

On May 23, 2022, our eleven-year-old male ostrich (Struthio camelus) suffered a puncture injury at the upper eyelid of left eye causing profuse frothy discharges, itching, anorexia and severe annoyance as it was infested with maggots. Medication could not be provided as the



ratite was not cooperating. Though risky, the ostrich was immobilized with ample precautions to minimize stress and trauma during induction and recovery of General Anesthesia. The clinical signs subsided and the wound healed up in about two weeks.

Dystocia and assisted parturition in a yellow anaconda (*Eunectes notaeus*)

One six-year-old female yellow anaconda (*Eunectes notaeus*) of Nandankanan gave birth to one snakelet, but failed to deliver further even after 48hrs of the first birth. After examination of abdomen through x-ray and ultrasonography, two doses of hormone 'oxytocin' were administered at 90 minutes apart. Nine snake lets were born including eight live and one dead within 3 hours of the second dose. This was the first birth of anaconda in the zoo.
