Nandankanan Zoological Park is one of the finest large zoos of India established on 29th December, 1960. The State Botanical Garden with an area of 75 hectares and adjoining two important wetlands Kanjia lake (66 ha.) and Kiakani lake (25 ha) make the Nandankanan an ideal centre for Research, Education, Conservation breeding. The Zoological Park together with Kanjia lake and Botanical Garden has been declared as Nandankanan Wildlife Sanctuary over an area of 4.37 sq.km. (Notified on 3rd August, 1979). The park is under the management of the Government of Odisha, Forest Environment& Climate Change Department and followings the norms and guidelines laid by Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi, Govt of India.

GARDEN IN FOCUS: ORCHID HOUSE

Orchids are plants that belong to the family Orchidaceae a diverse and widespread group of flowering plants with blooms that are often colourful and fragrant.Orchids are easily distinguished from other plants, as they share some very evident derived characteristics or synapomorphies. Among these are bilateral symmetry of the flower (zygomorphism), many resupinate flowers, a nearly always highly modified petal (labellum), fused stamens and carpels, and extremely small seeds.The largest Orchid House of the State spreads over an area of 5000 Sq. ft. and displays more than 1000 orchids of 57 varieties belonging to 37 species. One can enjoy the orchid in bloom round the year displaying various colour of nature.



SPECIES IN FOCUS: Water Monitor Lizard (Varanus salvator)

The water monitor lizard is a large varanid lizard native to South and Southeast Asia. They are semi aquatic, carnivorous and well adapted to human-disturbed habitats where they live close to water. The species is threatened due to indiscriminate hunting for skin for the global reptile leather trade. They are protected under schedule I of Wildlife Protection Act, 1972 and Appendix II CITES. The last breeding of the water monitor lizard took place in 27.03.2017. On 29.03.2017, 4 hatchlings of the species have been hatched under mother care in Reptile park of Nandankanan Zoological Park after 6



years. All the hatchlings are in sound health and active. With the said hatchlings, the number of Water Monitor Lizard increased to 2 males, 3 female and 5 hatchlings. As per the past experience of rearing Water monitor lizard in our zoo and the consultation made with Alipore Zoological Garden, Kolkata and Madras Crocodile Bank Trust, Chennai, their initial care, housing and dietary husbandry will be under taken.

HEALTH CARE HIGHLIGHTS

1. Successful hand raising of lion cubs, wolf cubs and sloth bear cub

On 10-01-2023, Asiatic lioness 'Rewa' gave birth to two cubs for the first time and could not take care of its babies due to lack of sufficient maternal instinct. The cubs were rescued and brought to the 'Hand Rearing Centre' of the zoo. Also, it was for the first time on 17-01-2023, in the history of Nandankanan zoo, that one wolf gave birth to six cubs out of which three were alive. As the cubs were not properly cared by the mother, they were also brought to the 'Hand Rearing Centre' and two of them survived. All lion cubs and wolf cubs are now being reared together with utmost care and precautions, presently all both of them are doing well with normal growth rate.

2. Treatment of female Hamadryas Baboon

On 21-02-2023, the female Hamadryas baboon 'Subha' was seen suffering from a wound at its ano-genital region. Detailed physical examination under immobilisation revealed severe myiasis and tissue damage. After careful removal of the maggots and dressing of the wound, the baboon was administered with intravenous fluid. The primate was kept at 'Inpatient Ward' for 10 days in a squeeze cage. Regular antibiotic and wound dressing resulted in uneventful recovery.
